Over the past 12 years, they performed overseas in France, Germany, Holland, Italy, Korea, Saudi Arabia, etc. and were on stage at the Olympics in Australia and Greece. Members of the dance troupe come from four tribes, namely, Nunukul, Yuggera, Yugimbir and Nugi, of Queensland. With didgeridoo, they mesmerize audiences around the globe with their dreamtime stories.

The dancing team of the College of Indigenous Studies is a three-time consecutive champion in traditional and creative dances in the National Intercollegiate Indigenous Dancing Contest. With passion in indigenous dance and music, they practice after classes and keep passing on the valuable cultural legacy.
